

Also they can answer any other questions you may have on your benefits or possible claims.



BLUE STAR BANNERS PROGRAM

In the spirit of pride in our men and women serving in the military, Roselle American Legion Post 1084 has an active "Blue Star Service Banners Program."

Blue Star Service Banners are displayed by families who have a loved one serving in the armed forces of the United States. The banner, when displayed in the front window of a home,

shows a family's pride in their loved one serving in the military and reminds others that preserving America's freedom demands a lot. If you have a loved one serving in the military, stop by the Post to apply for your banner.

The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Captain Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on the front line. It quickly became the unofficial symbol of a child in service. Blue Star Service Banners were widely used across America during World Wars I and II, but were not embraced during the Korean or Vietnam wars with the same enthusiasm.

The blue star represents one family member serving in the armed forces. A banner can have up to five stars signifying each member serving. If an individual is killed or dies while serving, the blue star is superimposed with a gold star. The Blue Star Mothers and Gold Star Mothers organizations were established during World War I and remain active today.

Eligible families may receive a banner by completing an application with information on the service member. The banners are provided at no cost to families. However, donations will be accepted and used for the Post's Veterans service programs.


