FROM THE SERVICE OFFICER

Need to File a Secondary Claim? File as a DRC.

Do you have a condition that was directly caused by or has gotten worse because of your serviceconnected condition? If so, you can file a secondary claim for disability compensation for that condition. If your planning to file a secondary claim, make sure you file it as a Decision Ready Claim (DRC). Filing as a DRC means you can get a decision on your claim in 30 days or less.

Work with an accredited Veterans Service Organization (VSO) to determine if the DRC Program is right for you and your secondary claim. Your VSO can then help you gather and submit all relevant and required evidence so your claim is ready for us to make a decision when you submit it. Don't have a secondary condition? You can also file these other types of compensation claims through the

Don't have a secondary condition? You can also file these other types of compensation claims through the DRC Program:

Direct Service Connection Claims Presumptive Service Connection Claims Increased Disability Claims Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (for surviving spouses)


